EICS GrACE Engagement Evening to Celebrate Catholic Education Oct. 21, 2022

"We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose." (Romans 8:28)

Elk Island Catholic School's GrACE Committee held an engagement session on October 21, 2022 to celebrate Catholic education. It was held at St. Francis Xavier Church in Camrose, Alberta, one of Elk Island Catholic's school communities.

EICS will be opening our new high school in Camrose in 2025. In addition to celebrating and sharing the importance of Catholic education the name of this new high school was revealed.

The Parish community quickly stepped up offering a meal to begin our event which was put on by the Knights of Columbus, CWL, PPC and parishioners. About 150 people came through the Church doors and were greeted by the Faith team members of St. Patrick Catholic elementary school along with Our Lady of Mount Pleasant football team. The Church hall was filled with conversation, laughter and joy.

Our division theme this year is Better Together: One Body in Christ (Romans 12:5). This theme focuses on community and the way God calls us to live together. After being apart for a few years due to COVID, it was apparent and heart-warming to witness this sense of community.

We were blessed to have an incredible line up of speakers including Archbishop Richard Smith, Father Kris Schmidt, Honourable Justice Kevin Feehan, and Stacey MacNeil-Ayeh.

Archbishop Richard Smith spoke eloquently about the beauty and significance of Catholic education. He, however, said that we cannot become complacent. We must take every possible opportunity to advocate and never take Catholic education for granted. He cautioned that other places lost Catholic education because the people let it go. They were not able to articulate the need for Catholic education. Catholic schools put Jesus Christ at the center and that is how we are able to fulfill the calling to educate the whole person. It is our responsibility and call to bring out each child's personal relationship with Jesus Christ. We cannot help each child to grow fully without a personal relationship with Christ. We want our students to know, love and follow Jesus as disciples. This is the reason for Catholic education.

Stacey MacNeil-Ayeh shared personal experiences from her time as a classroom teacher. She shared stories from the perspective of students and why they love Catholic education which we do not always get a chance to hear. Stacey reminded us that teachers live out a vocation that is a call from God and our significant role in Catholic education to form the whole child. What a beautiful gift and opportunity we have been given. Stacey ended by saying "There will not be a whimper, but a roar to silence those voices by those who want to take away Catholic education."

The Honourable Justice Kevin Feehan provided history to the constitutional right to Catholic education in the province of Alberta. He went on to say how critical it is that we hold on to that constitutional right. In the constitution act of 1867 we have section 93 which states the protection of Catholic education.

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That section is still there and has been protected even due to many legal battles. Feeham mentioned that there have been at least fifty challenges against Catholic education and every time, passionate advocates stood up and won. He told the audience that it is now our turn to stand up to protect Catholic education.

Father Kris Schmidt reminded us that God has given each child everything they need. We are called as Catholic educators to help bring that out. Everything we need comes from the source which is Jesus Christ and we must always allow everything to flow from that source. He went on to say that If we lose our connection to that source, we lose the purpose of Catholic education. When speaking about the important parish/school connection, he reminded us about the anchor, the classic Christian symbol for hope. This symbol reminds us that in order to move forward into the space which we currently don't know, we need to be grounded. The connection of our schools to our parishes is our continual reminder of who we are, where we come from, and where we are going. That's our hope.

This event achieved what all four speakers alluded to about Catholic education, which is, the importance of advocating, seeing the value, celebrating, and sharing the gift and blessings it brings.



Connected as Pilgrims in the Body of Christ

On October 20, 2022, the students of Our Lady of the Assumption participated in their annual student retreat. This year, we looked to fuse our faith plan and our call to turn inwards as pilgrims of hope with the Indigenous concept of the medicine wheel, which asks us to live our lives in balance and harmony. Students had the opportunity to consider what balance looks like in their own lives as they participated in eight centers, each focused around one of the four areas of the medicine wheel: mind, body, spirit, and heart.

We began our day with a short prayer service where we learned more about the medicine wheel and heard a Blackfoot prayer from Kristen Shade, our Blackfoot educator. Ms Shade also led one of the two HEART themed centers, inviting students to dip their hands in paint based on their birth month and contribute











a hand print to a large medicine wheel we went on to hang in the school. Throughout the day, students continued to explore their hearts by considering how the circle of courage calls on us to live in balance and reflecting on their own actions. They engaged their minds with a storytelling activity based around Indigenous learning and focusing on themes prevalent in our faith plan and considered how the medicine wheel could help them improve their own mental health.

Physically, our students designed and created their own stained glass images in keeping with the central image of our faith plan and participated in a VERY active medicine wheel relay sort in the gym! They also had the opportunity to connect spiritually, designing their own crosses in the colors of the medicine wheel with shrink art and constructing small rosaries and participating in a prayer rock ceremony of gratitude.

The day was greatly enjoyed by all students and staff and truly helped us see that when we learn and work together, we are all connected as pilgrims in the Body of Christ!



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Lumen Christi Catholic Education Centre

On Friday, September the 2 nd , with a blessing from Archbishop Richard Smith, Edmonton Catholic Schools officially christened its new Lumen Christi Catholic Education Centre. As part of the celebration, His Grace shared the passage from the gospel of Matthew and connecting the image of light, remarked about the beautiful rays of sunshine that flowed from the skylights in the atrium to the adjoining offices. At the conclusion of the liturgy, the Archbishop toured and blessed the individual spaces, including the Chapel which sits proudly at the front of the building, surrounded by beautiful stain glass windows that depict the liturgical seasons.





For us, the Lumen Christi Chapel serves as the building's beacon, calling staff for Mass, Liturgies of the Word, for praying the Rosary and the Liturgy of the Hours, and for Adoration. On October the 4 th, the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, Archbishop Richard Smith returned to Lumen Christi Catholic Education Centre to consecrate the Altar. This was a wonderful occasion to gather again in the Chapel, to sing, pray, listen, and to share in the Eucharistic meal.

Indeed, as followers of Jesus, living the beatitudes, we matter. We have an important role to play because we are the salt of the earth. Salt preserves and helps us preserve what is good in culture. In the same way, we are called to be light to the world. Our job description is not only to maintain personal holiness, but also to touch the lives of everyone around us; to be true witnesses in Christ.






