
Wear Blue & Walk Together for Catholic Education

Edmonton Catholic Schools gather 100 chaplains to engage around Catholic Education

Reigniting a Passion for Catholic Education with Edmonton Catholic School Chaplains

On January 25th ECSD School Chaplains participated in a GrACE engagement session to learn more about the history of educational rights as they apply to Catholic Education, and the importance of being advocates!

Sandra Talarico, Brittany Ottens, Kathleen Nguyen, and Susanna Kaup, together with Father Glenn McDonald and Father Julian Bilyj (Division Chaplains) presented to all ECSD Chaplains on the important role in being stakeholders in Catholic Education and GrACE's mission.

Many stories were shared about what inspires us about Catholic Education and why we chose to be Catholic educators. For some, the initial decision made by our parents to send them to Catholic school inspired a lifelong opportunity to share, nurture, and develop faith. Others found community in Catholic Education and loved being a part of sharing that with young people. For others still, we believe they make a true difference in nurturing the development of the whole child: mind, body, and spirit. Whatever the reason, the passion and conviction with which these educators teach compels them to make a true difference in the lives of their students!

After spending time listening to individual stories, the chaplains were guided through the history of Catholic education in the province of Alberta. Much learning occurred around how Catholic education began, how it is embedded in our constitutional rights, as well as what Catholic education looks like today.

Moving forward in Catholic Education, chaplains were reminded about the individual ways they could be advocates:

- 1. Pray for Catholic education to thrive.
- 2. Speak with a confident and positive voice both online and in conversation.
- 3. Ask questions of your elected officials.
- 4. Tell your story!
- 5. Get informed.

Last, we sent our chaplains off with a toolkit to help them reignite the passion for Catholic Education at their school sites. The presentation we gave chaplains will be segmented into 'bite-sized' bits so they can share the information with their colleagues at staff meetings. As more awareness about the beauty of Catholic Education is created, the more the value will be found.






